This fall, seven of our employees spent the morning helping to prepare the food bank at Oasis Dufferin Community Centre, an organization that has been supporting the community since 1994.

The food bank operates twice a week and can provide those in need with two to three days' worth of shelf-stable food, fresh produce, dairy and other protein.

From unloading boxes of donated goods from delivery trucks, assembling shelving, sorting canned and dry goods, and other odd jobs, the team from BWXT helped speed along the typical Tuesday morning setup and food bank volunteers were appreciative of the extra hands. Oasis Dufferin Community Centre relies on help from its routine volunteers and their focus is on providing food security and programs for community members.

Through our corporate giving program, BWXT recently provided a donation to Oasis Dufferin Community Centre to assist with the purchase of personal hygiene products

for the food bank. This is a type of good that is not often donated and therefore more difficult for the food bank to source for community members.

## Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission's Annual Public Meeting



The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) is Canada's nuclear regulator.

Because we handle natural uranium pellets and natural uranium powder, BWXT's Peterborough and Toronto facilities are licensed by the CNSC. We are subject to regulatory inspections and audits.

Each year, we submit an Annual Compliance Report (ACR) to the CNSC to demonstrate that BWXT has successfully met the requirements of the Nuclear Safety and Control Act and our Class IB Nuclear Fuel Facility Operating Licence. These Annual Compliance Reports are available at [nec.bwxt.com](http://nec.bwxt.com).

The CNSC holds an annual public meeting where they report on regulatory compliance for BWXT and other licensees. At the meeting, CNSC Staff will present their annual Regulatory Oversight Report for BWXT's Class IB Nuclear Fuel Facility Operating Licence.

This meeting is typically scheduled for the end of the year. In July, the CNSC published a revised notice, outlining the date for this public meeting has been changed to February 26, 2025.

## About BWXT NEC in Toronto

At BWXT NEC in Toronto, our employees manufacture ceramic pellets from natural uranium dioxide powder. After pressing, baking, grinding and inspecting the pellets, we send them to our Peterborough facility where they are placed in CANDU® fuel bundles. The fuel bundles are then sent to Ontario Power Generation's Darlington and Pickering Nuclear Generating Stations. Our Peterborough and Toronto facilities are licensed by Canada's nuclear regulator, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC).

About 40 people work for BWXT NEC in Toronto in high value manufacturing positions, engineering, and operations support. This site produces the fuel needed to power 1 in 4 homes and businesses in Ontario with greenhouse gas emissions-free, affordable electricity!
