**Discussion Notes:**

Augustin welcomed all attendees and began the meeting with a land acknowledgment followed by agenda review. Edwards then provided a safety moment. Augustin then introduced the guests from Creative Fire and reviewed open and ongoing action items from previous meetings.

Next, the guest speakers from Creative Fire provided an overview of how BWXT's Indigenous Relations Roadmap was developed and how the Indigenous Relations Roadmap was structured into seven strategic themes. Creative Fire shared that BWXT is in the process of finalizing actions and identifying next steps. CLC Member Dr. G. Sepczynska noted that the presentation was well done.

Augustin then shared community engagement updates, starting by noting that the annual drill is coming up this October and provided high level detail on what occurs. Augustin also shared that BWXT anticipates the CNSC will be sharing information about the upcoming Mid-Term Review Meeting soon. Augustin noted some ways that information is being shared in the community: Monthly Email Updates, Facebook Group & Social Media Advertisements, Mailed Postcards, and an upcoming Fall/Winter Community Newsletter. Augustin also noted that BWXT was highlighted in two recent media outlets: Junction Spin article September 23 titled, "What is Our Nuclear Neighbour Up to this Week" and that BWXT hosted Globe & Mail earlier that day for a media photo tour.

Augustin continued to share some community giving and volunteerism updates:

Augustin also shared some recent and upcoming community events and tours:

- Upcoming: NAYGN tour
- Upcoming: Community Event on November 4

Augustin then shared information from the website review session that three CLC members completed, noting the following data and feedback:

1. How would you rate your overall impression of the website? 5/5
2. How easy is it to navigate the website? 4/5
3. How would you rate the quality of the content? 5/5

Feedback:

- "Well done!"
- "No suggestions. The website is informative and esthetically very pleasing."
- "I see that the survey asked us to go to nec.bwxt.com, which is fine. However, if I Google BWXT or even BWXT Canada, it is very difficult to get to the Toronto and Peterborough specific information."
- "Very informative web site! The search function works well. I could have spent hours navigating through the site, it left me with full access to anything I would want to know. Thank you!"
- "Congratulations! The website is well done!"
- "If I put on a "nervous Nellie" hat (i.e. a person having doubts about nuclear energy), then in the Toronto virtual tour, the shipping manager refers to himself being the first and last lines of defence. Most people would not think anything of this, but a nuclear nervous Nellie might think "OMG, defence against what?!"."

Augustin then asked CLC members to share feedback and suggestions for discussion topics and community engagement. CLC Member Evans noted that BWXT could consider doing a paint night event or movie night for the community. CLC Member Desrochers shared that an open ice skating night would be fun to bring in the community.
